## **Getting Started**

- 1. Decide on your goals: Do you want to write a book to sell? Document your story for future descendants, historians, or genealogists? Provide a gift for your family?
- Think about influences, events, or stories that you might want to share. Pictures, journals, or keepsakes can help spark memories.
- Write as the inspiration and memories come. Don't feel constricted to share things in a certain order and or include everything.
- 4. Prefer recording instead? Choose a quiet place to record, free from distractions. Test your equipment. If using video, pay attention to the background and lighting. If recording for personal use, print a transcript. Digital platforms change rapidly.

## Sample Questions

- What do you remember most about the neighborhood you grew up in and people who lived there?
- Describe a typical family dinner. Did you all eat together as a family? Who did the cooking? What were your favorite foods?
- What world events had the most impact on you when you were a child (or teen, or adult)?
  Did any of them personally affect your family?
- $\checkmark$  4. Of all the things you learned from your parents, what do you feel was the most valuable?
- 5. How did you like school? What was your favorite (or least favorite) subject and why? What kinds of activities did you participate in? Describe your friends and acquaintances.
- 6. Has there ever been anyone in your life you would consider a kindred spirit or soul mate? Who were they and why did you feel a special bond with them?
- $\checkmark$  7. What was your profession and how did you choose it?
- 8. What were the hardest choices you ever had to make?
- 9. What person really changed the course of your life by something they did?
- 10. Do you remember any advice or comments that had a big impact on how you lived your life?
